Please remember to use water wisely.

Leaf Pick-Up will begin soon and continue until mid December unless there is major snow prior to mid December.

NEW INSTRUCTIONS

Leaves must be placed at least 20 feet away from poles, cars, and other obstructions either curbside or in the back alley.

This will allow easy access for our new one-man leaf vacuum truck to maneuver for pick-up.

NO TARPS or COVERINGS!

The Borough employees will not be getting out of the truck, they will not come across your property to remove them in order to collect your leaves.

KEEP BRUSH AND GRASS CLIPPINGS SEPARATE FROM LEAVES or they will NOT be picked up!

Zoning Permits are required. Please contact the Borough Office to obtain and fill out a zoning permit. The Zoning Officers will then direct you to our Building Code Administrator, Harry Burd if necessary.

State Wide Building Code Construction within the Borough must meet minimum standards for new construction.

Brush Pick-Up - two days only **Tuesday, October 9th** for the East side of Pennsylvania Avenue and **Wednesday, October 10th** for the West side. Brush must be curbside by 7:00 a.m. each day. There will NOT be a second trip around.

Special notes: Tree branches do not need to be cut short. If tree trunks are greater than 8 inches in diameter, the property owners must make other arrangements to haul the tree trunk away. **Please stack brush with butt ends toward the road.** Small branches need to be bundled and tied with a string.

NO WIRE. Shrub trimmings (Thorn bushes, rose bushes, and grape vines) are not brush and should be composted or properly disposed of by the property owner, phone the Borough office for information on where to take them. All trees on Borough or State right-of-ways are maintained by the Borough. **Reminder** - Please keep Brush & Shrubs trimmed back off of the Alleys.

Tips to conserve WATER:

Animal Defecation

Ordinance requires **dog and cat** owners to pick up after their animals. With continued violations, **finest can be as high as \$600.00.** Animals are not permitted to run loose in the Borough.

Barking Dog Ordinance

The owner is responsible for keeping their dog quiet and under control or they will be cited. **Fines for this violation can be up to \$300.00.**

Rein in Your Cats

Cats cannot run loose. They must be kept inside or on your property. **Fines for loose cats are up to \$300.00.**

Ordinance Violations

To file a complaint the filer must leave their name, phone number, and be willing to testify in court.

Protect our Sidewalks

Encourage people **NOT** to park on the sidewalks. **Fine is \$25.00.** There are designated handicap parking stalls in the business district. Please do not use "Rock Salt" on the sidewalks it eats away the finish - please consider using a deicing agent to help maintain the new appearance.
