East Tuesday, April 9th. West Wednesday, April 10th, East Tuesday, October 1st West Wed., October 2nd Brush must be curbside by 7:00 a.m. each day of pickup. NO second trip around. **Special notes:** Tree branches do not need to be cut short. If tree trunks are greater than 8 inches in diameter. the property owners must make other arrangements to haul the tree trunk away. Please stack brush with butt ends toward the road and cut to a size to go through a shredder. Small branches need to be bundled and tied with a string - NO WIRE.
