### Brush Pick-Up

East Tuesday, April 7th. West Wednesday, April 8th, East Tuesday, October 6th West Wed., October 7th Brush must be curbside by 7:00 a.m. each day of pickup. NO second trip around. **Special notes:** Tree branches do not need to be cut short. If tree trunks are greater than 8 inches in diameter, the property owners must make other arrangements to haul the tree trunk away. Please stack brush with butt ends toward the road and cut to a size to go through a shredder. Small branches need to be bundled and tied with a string - NO WIRE. Shrub trimmings, Thorn or rose bushes, and grape vines are not brush compost these items or place in with your trash.

All trees on Borough or State right-of-ways are maintained by the Borough.

## Leaf Pick-Up

Tuesday, April 14th,
Fall - until the snow begins
The leaves must be placed
curbside at least 20 feet
away from poles, cars, and
other obstructions either
curbside or in the back alley.
This will allow easy access
for the leaf vacuum truck to
maneuver.

#### NO TARPS or COVERINGS!

The Borough employees will not be getting out of the truck, they will not come across your property to remove them in order to collect your leaves.

Keep BRUSH AND GRASS

CLIPPINGS SEPARATE FROM LEAVES or the leaves will NOT be picked up!

#### **Zoning Permits**

are required. Please contact the Borough Office to obtain and fill out a zoning permit. The Zoning Officers will then direct you to our Building Code Administrator Harry Burd, if necessary.

Ordinance Violations - To file a complaint the filer needs to leave their name, phone number, and be willing to testify in court.

**Animal Defecation Ordinance** This ordinance requires dog and cat owners to pick up after their animals. Fines as high as \$600.00 with continued violations. Animals are not permitted to run loose in the Borough.

**Barking Dog Ordinance** It is the owner's responsibility to keep their dog(s) quiet and under control. Fines up to \$300.00 for continuous barking of more than 10 minutes.

**Rein in Your Cats!** Cats cannot run loose. Cats must be kept inside or on your property. Fines up to \$300.00.
